The Circle of Success Keeps Growing...

Did you notice the change in Lilly's demeanor before and after she graduated from AMH? These pictures tell the story. When she came to us, Lilly was 8-1/2 months pregnant with her son Dominic. She knew only a handful of people, and none of them were able to house her and her soon-to-be born child. Since she was neither a citizen, nor a long-term resident, she was unable to access any government-supported housing or financial aid programs. Thankfully, when Lilly explained her situation to Nashua Welfare, someone there knew about our program and referred her to us. The rest is history! It may have taken Lilly longer than some to navigate the immigration system, but once she acquired her "green card", there was no stopping her. Many people helped along the way. We owe thanks to the Adult Learning Center and AMH "tutors" who helped with her English. Thank you to everyone who drove Lilly and Dom to the Nashua Public Library's "Babies & Books Storytime" where her socialization skills expanded, as well as those who took her to the NH Food Bank's "Recipe for Success" culinary arts program from which she graduated. Finally, thank you to each and every one of you who have contributed to ending Lilly's story of homelessness! Together we can do so much.

And now there's Carrie's continuing story of success...Carrie graduated from AMH in March of 2007 and has been living independently with her son, since then. Now I am pleased to announce that on May 13, Carrie was elected to the AMH Board of Trustees – the first of our graduates to ever have this distinction. Yes, the circle of AMH success stories keeps growing.


Future Events
